

Sew-In - May 31, 2008

Where: Lyle Buck Hall

When: 10am – 4pm'ish

Project: Windows into the Jungle (a.k.a. Attic Windows)

Now that you have had the opportunity to learn from some of quilting's finest quilters, here's a chance to come back down to the simple life. With the Attic Windows block, we will explore the mysteries of half-square triangles and chain sewing. This pattern is good for beginners or anyone who has the ideal fabric or just wants a simple project. Even if you don't want to do the project, everyone is welcome to come to the sew-in - bring your own project and socialize!

Here's the info on the "Windows into the Jungle" workshop:

The finished Attic Windows quilt size is 46 ½" X 46 ½" with the blocks finished at 6" x 6". This will have 5 rows, 5 columns. You will need:

- Paper and pencil if you want to try templates
- 5/8 yard each of two different fabrics for the 2 sides of the blocks
- 5/8 yard for sashing and inner border
- ½ yard for blocks (or more if you choose to fussy cut the 5" squares)
- 3/8 yard for binding
- 1 ½ yards for a 5" border
- 3 yards for backing
- 52" square batting
- And your usual sewing tools such as a machine

Of course you can make this quilt larger or smaller and adjust the yardage accordingly.
